Jobelyn on Trial at Dana Faber Cancer Center

An American, whose wife is an associate professor in the department of occupational therapy, Boston University, Massachusetts, USA. He had Acute Myeloid Leukemia, refractory type M-O. He received three courses of chemotherapy between October and January 1996-1997. Two weeks after the last chemotherapy, his leukemia relapsed. He went for another protocol in which he received lymphocyte infusion (helper – T cells) followed by three weeks of interleukin 2. injections. In spite of all these, his blast continued to increase and the haematocrit kept going down. He was transfused with two pints of whole blood every other day. He also received multiple platelet transfusions. His case was dismissed by his doctors at Dana Farber Cancer Centre (one of the best two cancer centers in the world) as irredeemable. He was given two days to live after discharge from Hospital. His wife, Elsie, placed an order for Jobelyn capsules through the internet. Samples of Jobelyn were sent to her and were administered on her husband who was admitted for acute myeloid leukemia at Dana Farber Cancer Institute Boston. He was already discharged and given two to three days at most to die because his body rejected all the blood transfused. Jobelyn helped to prolong his life for more than he was expected to live. Though the patient is now deceased, his condition while on this therapy could best be summarized in the spouse's own words. "The Jobelyn definitely stabilized his hematocrit for as long as he took it and it may have prolonged his life a few weeks. Having been able to keep him alive for a month after they thought he was going to die, was worth it".

Dear M. O. Okubena:

I am extremely interested in your Jubi Formula. What I have read on the net and on the report you just sent me gives us a ray of hope.

My husband has Acute Myelogenous Leukemia. He received three treatments of chemotherapy between October and January of 1996-1997. Two months after the last chemotherapy, his leukemia relapsed. He subsequently underwent a bone marrow transplant, but the leukemia relapsed again six months later. He went for another protocol in which he received linfocyte infusions (helper T-cells) followed by three months of Interleuken 2 injections. His blasts continued to increase to the point that the doctors felt the "only" remaining treatment was another series of chemotherapy.

He just completed his last chemo two weeks ago, but the leukemic cells, although initially decreased, have returned. His current counts reveal 50% blasts. His hematocrit this morning was 23, but he is getting two blood transfusions today. His platelet count after a platelet transfusion yesterday was 37. His white blood count I believe is around 750 (.75).

At this stage, I do realize that whatever we try may or may not work, but we are seriously willing to try this. I should mention that for 1 month prior to his bone marrow transplant, he went for acupuncture and herbal teas and, although the blood counts did not change significantly, his overall well being did, as did many other related symptoms. We strongly believe that part of the reason that he did so well DURING the bone marrow transplant process was the well-balanced state in which he went in for the transplant, more than likely as a result of the complementary medicine.

Please let me know what I have to do to receive the four weeks of Juni Formula, as you offer in this letter. I have discussed this with my husband's doctors (he is currently still in the hospital) and they agree, and have encouraged us, to try your product. Please contact us as soon as possible, because at this stage, every single minute that goes by is extremely important for us.

Thank you very much for what you are doing for so many individuals suffering from terminal illnesses.

We acknowledge receipt of your email which came this evening. Your request is receiving a prompt attention. We intend to dispatch a consignment of 30 capsules for your husband by Courier Service and hope that it would be received latest by Tuesday May 5, 1998. Although the normal dosage for each capsule is 250 mg., we have decided to send the capsules in 400-mg. dosage because of the status of your husband's illness. The recommended dosage is 1 Capsule per day and the consignment is supposed to last for 30 days. Dear Ms. Okubena:

I will notify you immediately when we receive the Jubi formula. We will definitely begin to use it IMMEDIATELY upon arrival.

Since my husband is currently in the hospital, it will be very easy for us to get all of the records you need almost on a daily basis. There is one question: when you say "status of the bone marrow", what exactly do you mean? He will not be getting any more bone marrow biopsies in the near future, because it is clear that his leukemia is VERY active on the basis of the blasts circulating on his blood stream, thus a biopsy would not be indicated (it is obvious from the blasts that the marrow is dysfunctional). I will send to you any information that I get from the doctors periodically. My husband's situation has been further complicated by a pneumonia which he developed last week. This is being treated with antibiotics. If the Jubi Formula can actually either revert or even halt the deterioration of his marrow, I guarantee you that it will make a major impact on the doctors who are treating him, who are among the best in the nation! Let's keep up our faith and pray for such change! From the literature that I have read about Jubi, I am confident that it would make a positive change. Thanks.

I will be mailing to you copies of the medical records, labs, etc, that you requested. The tests cover the period from the 1st through the 4th of May, 1998. Please note that in the USA, dates are recorded with the month first, followed by the day of the month; thus, 05/04/98 stands for the 4th day of May, 1998, rather than for the 5th day of April, like it out be in many countries.

I will be sending you additional reports periodically, as you have requested. I will also be keeping track of his progress to report it to his physician. Dear Mr. Okubena:

I sent a very detailed report with all of the labs that had been run on my husband prior to beginning the Jubi Formula to your address in London. The one thing I did not send was his diagnosis. His diagnosis is:

Acute Myeloid Leukemia, refractory, type M - 0

As I mentioned before, he initiall (Oct. 96 - Jan. 97) received three sessions of chemotherapy with Daneurobicin and ARAC-C. He went in remission after the second round of chemotherapy, but they gave him a third round as a "consolidation" treatment. His leukemia returned after less than two months. At that point, they recommended a bone marrow transplant, which was received on May 22, 1997. After an apparently successful bone marrow transplant, his leukemia returned again, this time much more intensely. At that point, he received a phoresis treatment (transfussion) from his sister's T-cells (his sister had been his bone marrow donor). He also received three months of treatment with Interleukin 2, without success. At that point, he was very debilitated, with less than 1000 WBC and approximately 70% leukemic cells in his blood. The doctors recommended then, as the last resort, another course of chemotherapy only hoping to decrease the blasts (leukemic cells) to prolong his life for some time.

Since January, my husband has been requiring at least two (up to four) pints of blood each week and at least one (some times two) bags of platelets. Since in the hospital, he has required blood (two pints)

every other day and platelets every two to three days. Yesterday he received three bags of platelets and three pints of blood to stop his rectal bleeding and to replace lost blood.

I will be sending the blood and other chemistry reports for the past week, but there is no way to tell the effects of Jubi from these reports, being that has been receiving so many blood products at the same time... I was slightly concerned (although not doubting the effectiveness of the product) that Jubi could have had something to do with the bleeding. It was reassuring to hear from your representative in London (who has been wonderful!) that this has not been a sign associated with Jubi. I will continue to use Jubi until you instruct me otherwise, or until my husband passes away.

The nurse is collecting nursing notes from this week to send you a summary of what has happened this week.

Please expect to receive these reports via email tomorrow or Friday. My husband is being discharged tomorrow and we are dealing with all of the preparations to take him home. It will take me a while to collect everything and summarize it to send to you. Please bear with me in the meantime. Thanks.

Dear Titi:

I apologize for not responding to your last email message. My husband was sent home last week on Thursday (May 14th) to die! His bleeding stopped, but the doctors felt there was nothing else to be done with him. Since he came home, he has done slightly better, but is still considered terminal. When he came home, the doctors felt he would not survive longer than two or three days. So far he has survived ten days and seems to be stable, although seriously ill.

I am having a difficult time sorting out what information to send to you. I have lab reports for the past two weeks and I expect to mail them to you at the latest on Tuesday. I just have not been able to leave my husband alone to go to the post office to mail your package.

The main difficulty I have is that if I send the lab reports to you alone, without a chronology of when his bleeding occurred, when he received blood transfusions (and how many each time), etc. I just have not had time to do this with all of the intensive treatment he is receiving at home, and I am the one in charge of his care. I am planning on taking some time tomorrow to sort all of this information out.

One thing I did notice was that last Saturday, for the first time, his hematocrit increased without he receiving a transfusion. On Monday he received two pints of blood, although his hematocrit was 27.3, which for him normally does not require transfusion. Three days later his hematocrit was still above 30. the doctors were surprised because in the past few weeks he was losing whatever blood he would receive within two days and this time his hematocrit remained stable. Maybe Jubi is working!!!

Once again, thank you for your willingness to allow my husband to benefit from Jubi. He has only 11 more capsules remaining. We want to know how can we get more. Please advise immediately as to how to order, etc.

Thanks. Please expect to here from me by tomorrow.

Thanks for your email. From now on, I will send you a copy of any email correspondence I send to Titi. Sorry about that! The progress that my husband has made involves only the hematocrit (for now, I hope!). He has not received red blood cells in the last ten days, whereas prior to this he was getting two pints of blood every other day, more or less! However, it is hard to tell if this is exclusively due to Jubi because he had been apparently bleeding internally for a few days when he was requiring blood daily or every other day and this confounds the findings. Despite of this, my husband's physician is very impressed because he would have expected for him to need blood at least twice during the period that he has not needed any! We now need for it to start working on his GOOD white blood cells—his leukemic cells (blasts) in the last blood count on Monday was 78%. My husband (his name is Juan) is still critically ill and they expect for him to die any minute! This is why we are SO desperate. We are intensely praying that Jubi will do the work and, believe me, if it does, you are going to have a lot of the most respected hematology oncologists in the nation (and the world) asking you about it! I don't know if I had mentioned it, but Juan is receiving treatment at Dana Farber Cancer Institute, which is one of the two best cancer centers in the world!

Thanks again for giving us the final hope for my husband's health!

Please advise. What can he take and what can he definitely NOT take while taking Jubi?

Thank you for clarifying about what products/medications my husband may or may not be taking. On Monday, my husband's hematocrit went down again to 24.5, but he went two weeks without requiring red blood cell transfusions, which is a "record"—since January, he could not go longer than 5 days without needing red blood cells. Today he got up feeling extremely weak and having fever and urinary difficulties. I suspect that he is having another infection! I am truly hoping that Jubi works fast because he is feeling extremely tired and is no longer fighting to stay alive!

Thanks for your email which was received this afternoon. I am pleased to note that Jubi appears to be contributing to the recovery of your husband. I am also hoping that the blasts would be put under control within the next couple of weeks or so since we are aware that Jubi as a normalizer has the power to normalize the white blood cells. I want to believe that the forecast by the doctors that your husband could die at anytime may be misplaced after all. We are praying along with you for the full recovery of your husband and this would demonstrate to the medical world that there are more to natural remedies than the orthodox medical practitioners would want to admit.

I noted from your email that your husband is not on chemotherapy and would also not be interested in it. This is good for him particularly as chemotherapy would negate the advantages to be derived from Jubi therapy. Dear Mr. Okubena:

Thanks for your messages. I apologize for not replying to your email messages, but the email system I was using from the hospital did not work from the house and I had to change to Netscape. I think that all of the problems have been corrected now.

My husband's infection did not progress and, in terms of this, he is OK. His platelets have continued to gravely decrease---yesterday (Friday, 5 June) they were below 1,000 and he was given one bag of platelets. His hematocrit was 29 and the doctor was again impressed. Once again he commented that maybe it was the Jubi keeping the hematocrit stable, because they would have expected for it to decrease. His white blood cells are "stable" at about 1.5 - 1.6, with 80% blasts. This is another thing that the doctor thinks is going different from what should have been expected. He said that typically, at Juan's stage, the white blood cells should have been doubling or tripling each day, thus markedly increasing the absolute number of blasts (leukemic cells). This has not happened—is this something that could also be attributed to Jubi?

On your last Email you commented that maybe you had other suggestions to help my husband. What are those? I would be extremely interested in anything that would raise the platelets and decrease the percentage of blasts, both the circulating blasts and the ones in the marrow! I am aware that natural (herbal, etc.) treatment tends to be slower than western medicine, but I am willing to try anything. Someone is sending me the root of a plant in Honduras that is supposed to boost the bone marrow—have you heard of anything to this effect? I don't even know what it is, but I will let you know as soon as I find out.

I am pleased to note that your husband's infection did not progress and that he is making some progress. We believe that Jubi Formula would provide the total remedy for your husband's illness. It has provided remedy for many cancer patients over the last twenty years. Hi, Mr. Okubena.

I am sorry that I did not respond any sooner. My husband's condition aggravated and I had to take him back to the hospital last week. I don't know if by now Titi has informed you that Juan passed away on Sunday. He had another rectal bleeding on Saturday and did not respond to the two transfusions they gave him.

I want for you to know that I am very, very grateful for what you did for us. You at least gave us some hope when everything else was not working.

Although I do not want for you to think that I am implying that you or your company are in any way at fault, I have wondered if the Jubi formula somehow (directly or indirectly) contributed to his bleeding. His first rectal bleeding occurred shortly (within a couple of days) after we started Jubi; his second rectal bleeding also occurred shortly after we increased his dose. I feel compelled to inform you of this because you may need to or want to follow potential bleeding as part of your research on the product. Although it may have only been a coincidence, taking the Jubi at a late stage, with low platelet levels, and with severe gastric problems/hyperacidity, may (perhaps) promote intestinal bleeding. Again, it is quite possible that this was just a coincidence, but I felt it necessary to inform you about this as you continue your research on the product. The Jubi definitely maintained his hematocrit stable for as long as he took it and it may have also prolonged his life a few weeks. Having been able to keep him alive for a month after they thought he was going to die was worth it! God was good to him and, according to his will, gave him rest from such a long and difficult ordeal. Thank you for all your help and support. I will send a copy of the final medical reports in a few days.

Titi came back to Nigeria on Friday and that was when she informed me about your husband's passing away. She was very distressed and could not muster up the courage to tell me on the phone before she left

London. On behalf of myself and our organization, we send our message of condolence for this sad event. You have done your very best and we are very impressed by your courage and the great love you displayed for your late husband. May his soul rest in perfect peace. We noted your comment on the possible contribution of Jubi Formula to the bleeding which occurred on two occasions during the administration

of the compound. As I mentioned earlier in my previous email, we have not observed this type of reaction in all the patients who have been placed on Jubi over the last twenty years. This notwithstanding, we

have referred this complaint to our medical consultants for further review and research. Again, we were surprised that Jubi Formula did not raise the number of your husband's platelets. We are currently

using Jubi Formula for a four-year old child having Leukemia and within a period of 3 weeks, his platelets increased from 40,000 to 180,000.

Our organization is committed to contributing to the alleviation of the suffering of people with terminal illnesses across the world and this is what the idea of Jubi Formula is all about. It is indeed unfortunate that it was pretty too late before we intervened in your husband's case. While we are making progress with the efforts being made in our country we are still looking forward to further trials particularly in the USA.

We would be looking forward anxiously to receiving the final medical reports as promised. It would also be very helpful to us if your husband's consultant and doctor could give us some comments on what beneficial and adverse effect they believe Jubi Formula has on him during the period he was on the therapy. If the doctors are interested we could let them have details of the research done at our Teaching
